A beautiful jewel has been struck for this purpose and it shall be awarded to those Companions who have performed the following ritualistic parts:

1. Conferred the Mark Master Degree as Right Worshipful Master
2. Conferred the Past Master Degree as Right Worshipful Master
3. Conferred the Most Excellent Master Degree as Right Worshipful Master
4. Conferred the royal Arch Degree as the High Priest (Joshua)

The Companion must have performed the above parts **from memory**, on at least two (2) occasions for actual candidates. The work must be accomplished being the time period of January 1, 2002 and August 15, 2008.

What is the ceremony of “passing the chair”?

In some, not in all, Grand Lodge, it is necessary that a Master-elect be either an actual Past Master before his installation, or a virtual Past Master, by having received the Pat Master’s degree in a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons.

To make a Master-elect an “Actual Past Master” recourse is had to an emergent or occasional lodge, formed of Past Masters only, by dispensation of the Grand Master, which group performs the simple but highly symbolic ceremony of giving a Master-elect certain instructions and impressing certain facts upon him, designed to make his Mastership of his lodge more effective.

ROYAL ARCH MASONRY

Masonry, Symbolic Masonry or Blue Lodge Masonry, is the oldest and largest fraternal organization in the world. The Masonic Lodges are subordinate to the Grand Lodge of the Jurisdiction in which they reside. There is no governing body Nationally or Internationally for the Masonic Fraternity, however, they did have the head of each of these Jurisdictions meet on regular occasions. Royal Arch Masonry is said to have derived its origin from the Masonic Degrees and Traditions. The Chapters of Royal Arch Masonry hold their allegiance to the State Grand Chapter. Most State Grand Chapters belong to the General Grand Chapters belong to the General Grand Chapter International making Royal Arch Masonry the largest Fraternal Organization in the world under one Supreme Body.

Masonry and Royal Arch Masonry are not a religion and do not endeavor to fix ones conception of God. Royal Arch Masonry regards your religious belief as your own; it does not attempt to influence your belief. It only asks that you have a belief. The motto of the Royal Arch is “Holiness to the Lord” and ever reminds us of the reverence due to Great and Beneficent Author of our existence, who is a Being without beginning of days or ending of years.

The Royal Arch holds firm to the belief in the Brotherhood of Man, the Fatherhood of God, and the Immortality of the Human Soul in high regard. He, therefore, who is a member knows that nowhere within the halls will anything occur to cause him to forfeit his self-respect, or give him the slightest embarrassment. Capitular Masonry is intensely human; it has its serious aspects and its humorous side.

As a member of the Royal Arch you will be welcome and greeted with hospitality and friendship in any Chapter of Royal Arch Masons in your travels around the world, upon displaying proof of your membership.

MASONS SPONSOR PROGRAM

Most of us, when we get in the car, put on the seatbelt. Most of us, when we leave home for the day, make sure the stove is off. Most of us, when we cross the street, look both ways. The daily acts of caution and safety become second nature. We do it and teach our children to do it. However, some situations are just so hard to consider, we may ignore what we could do to be proactive and prepared should it happen.

A missing child is any parent's worst nightmare. According to information from a White House Conference on missing and exploited children, each year in America tens of thousand of children are abducted by nonfamily members, often in connection with a crime. Statistics show that the faster authorities are alerted and the more identifying details that are provide, the better the chances of a child being returned.

In the midst of horror and fear, parents are asked to provide police with extensive information that is generally not at their fingertips. Being prepared with the important forensic details of children is not something people typically think of.

The Masonic Fraternity is attempting to equip families with the tools needed in the event of a missing child. The Michigan Masons Child Identification Project (MI-CHIP) is a program that is brought to local schools. With parental permission, volunteers collect dental impressions, DNA samples, height and weight measurements, pictures, fingerprints, and voice recordings from children.

The information is entered into a computer and burned onto a disk. The disk is put in a resealable bag, along with the DNA information and dental samples, and given to the parents. All information, gathered by school employees is erased from the computer. The program is provided to Michigan citizens at no cost.

According to Stockbridge Police Chief Michael King the information provided in the packets developed by the Masons and given to parents is extremely useful for police.

Members from several area Mason Lodges visited Smith Elementary Wednesday, March 7. The effort, spearheaded by Jim Miller, Master of Stockbridge Lodge, obtained identification information from 30 preschoolers.

"We wanted to keep the numbers low the first time so we could get a handle on how many students could be run through the process in one day," explained Miller.

"We hope this information will never be needed, but in the event that it is need, it will give law enforcement one more tool," he concluded.

Miller said if there is enough local support for the program, the Masons will continue to the other grades.
