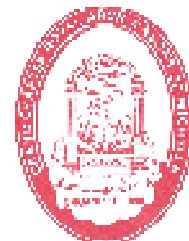
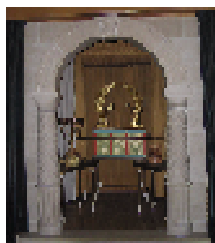

Mentoring

Many of you will recall that when you thought about asking for information about the York Rite or one of its bodies, there was someone that you were drawn to for answers. He was likely well respected in the fraternity or perhaps was even a friend who you knew would give honest and sincere answers to your questions. If you were lucky enough to receive a petition for the Degrees and/or Orders from him and have him as your Recommender, you knew that he would be there for you throughout your journey and beyond.

Unfortunately, these days more and more of our petitioners are not quite so lucky. Our Society is closing in on itself socially and there are so many things vying for our time. Many of our newest members are finding the information they seek by other means (brochures, Internet sites, Masonic books, etc.) and often make the decision to join with little personal commitment or help from others. Much of this information is inadequate and impersonal. I find it sad when someone joins our fraternity and then soon leaves because he did not find what he was looking for. Often it was merely because he did not have someone to initially ask the right question to or because he did not feel a friendly and welcome atmosphere. I believe that if he had had an effective Mentor to make introductions and help him get involved, he would have had a better experience and stayed.

I have often told my Brothers and Companions that if they are the first line Recommender on someone's petition for membership, they MUST commit themselves to not only attest to their character but also be their mentor for at least the next year. A mentor should be there to support, assist, motivate, and answer questions and share experiences. A new member needs to know that he is appreciated and has a friend in the organization during the initial period. One year should give him time to become familiar with the particularities of the new organization and to create relationships with others and then he will be able to become independent.

Companions, please remember that your candidates and new members need you. Welcome them and assist them at every opportunity. Be friendly and helpful to all. More importantly, be a mentor to someone who needs your assistance. Your organization depends on it and you both may grow because of it. -- Jim Kiefer, GPS

Retention

This is the third article that I have written on retention in the last nine months. I would hope that there was some knowledge and useful information that could help our Chapters retain and increase the attendance of their membership.

Communication in my opinion is the number one in retaining the attendance of our membership. I tried to outline some ways to better communicate with our members. Low cost mass phone calls, e-mail, post cards and newsletters are some of the ways to keep you members informed. I have no doubt that there are others that I have not touched upon, and if they are working I would not change, BUT if they are not, I would consider a change.

Chapter activities are another way to retain members, if your chapter is active in the community or you plan after meeting activities such as euchre, pool, movie showings. These again are just some ideas. Family activity planning will help also. I would submit that Ladies activities during meeting will make it easier for your members to attend.

Pride in your chapter is a great way to increase attendance. One of the best ways to create pride is to do your own degree work. When you accomplish that your chapter may be asked to do a degree at an all degree day, at which time your fellow companions will see your good work. When your chapter is asked to help don't think of it as a choir, it is an honor, someone thinks enough of your chapters ability to do the work to ask for your help. What could make you prouder? We all know companions who do great work and are proud to have them in our chapters. Think of the feeling of being part of a degree team that is asked to travel and do degrees. Learning a part is hard work, performing a part is fun, if you are having fun at what you are doing, pride comes for free. Remember there is nothing that says your chapter can not help a Blue Lodge with their degree work also. You could go as a chapter in your red coats and put on a degree for a Blue Lodge in your region that has asked for help. Think of it as silent membership drive.

To speculate and surmise my last three articles, if you communicate to your membership in a better way and more often, you could expect to increase attendance. I would hope that is true. When your chapter activity level is increased it would also stand to reason that your attendance level would increase. When you add these two along with pride your chapter will realize the biggest bang for the buck so to speak. Pride in you work, pride in your activities, pride in your chapter, this will create a buzz in your community in which your chapter not only may increase attendance but could also increase membership.

The Book of Proverbs provides the Royal Arch Mason a lesson that we might not otherwise contemplate and which is certainly germane to our work in the chapter.

“Do you see a man skilled in his work? He will serve before kings, he will not serve before obscure men” Proverbs 22:29.

In the ritual of our Royal Arch Degree we introduce two names which are odd and might appear to be insignificant. They are used without definition and without explanation. Bezalel and Oholiab are two characters of the old testament. We know very little about them yet we know quite enough.

Bezalel was the son of Uri of the tribe of Judah. He was an artificer of the first order.

He was handpicked by God to produce the Ark of the Covenant. Oholiab was an associate and by the scriptural reference we can confidently believe that he too was a craftsman. They are mentioned together in reference to the construction of the tabernacle and the production of the many items used in the service of the priests in the tabernacle. Their skills set them apart from the other craftsmen to be named in the scripture, yet apparently they otherwise labored without particular promotion or reward.

Our work in the chapter, in service and in the ritual, is taxing. It’s not easy. It’s another of those things that freemasons just do. Yet, if we examine the reputation of these two heros of our craft, it appears that we have models for our labor.

Clearly, these are two artists, who could produce items worthy of presentation before their God. However, it may be that their more significant contribution rests not in what they did but rather in what they gave to others, for the scriptures point out that they both were given the ability to teach others (Exodus 35: 30-35). The importance of that ability to teach can not be overstated.

Having visited our chapters throughout the state, we see some beautiful ritual. Wise and scholarly companions lead candidates through the ritual of our craft, but frequently the new members are left to ponder and contemplate the temple and the labors that produced it without instruction. There is no apprenticeship and we find that they don’t return to our meetings and choose not to labor with us, or they are thrown into the labors of the chapter without that proper instruction and fail.

Our craft will prosper in proportion to our ability and willingness to teach and lead as well as laboring in the craft, to share our knowledge and love of the craft. In short, It will prosper as we imitate the model of Bezalel and Oholiab, laboring at the peak of our skill, while teaching others. Laboring without necessarily finding reward except for that great reward of completing a job well done. A greater reward which cannot be overstated is that of the perpetuation of our craft.

Companions, Plans for the 2010-11 Capitular Year are well underway and consist of several projects

1. Enhance the Secret Program:
 - a. This program has several pieces. We plan to have 3 more Awareness Events designed to inform the attendee as to the Structure and Form of Royal Arch Masonry specifically and the York Rite in general. It consists of a Dinner followed by a short public skit related to Royal Arch activities, and a DVD presentation on the York Rite.
 - b. The Mentoring Program will be the expanded focus of our efforts this year. We will create a Mentoring Manual which will be available through the Grand Chapter's WEB Site: www.ram-mi.org.
 - c. The Education Committee is working on a series of Educational Articles that may be used by the Education Officer in his monthly presentations. These will also be available on the WEB Site.
 - d. There has been a Candidate Counseling Processes available which the Education Committee will be reviving and updating. This Process is to be used by all Chapters and specifically at the All Degree Days.
2. RAM Foundation:
 - a. Your Royal Arch Foundation is moving forward with Money Making events, among which will be Sponsoring Texas Hold-M nights. They need assistance, so please help. The Foundations Goal will be \$5,000, this year. A portion of the income generated may support Grand Chapter programs and thereby fewer per-capita increases need to be made.
 - b. RAM Foundation contributions are greatly appreciated. A Lapel Pin is available for anyone contributing \$100 or more and a beautiful Plaque for a \$500 gift.
3. Royal Arch Research Assistance:
 - a. Your Philanthropy Committee will be working hard this year to hit a goal of \$3,000 for this charity.
 - b. The committee is looking into doing another Raffle this year.
4. Triple Tau, published 10 times per year, is a Publication of Royal Arch Masons in Michigan containing news and information from several sources:
 - The Grand High Priest's Message
 - The Grand King's Korner
 - The Grand Secretaries Scribbles
 - Reports and Articles from the Grand
 - Information from your Grand Committees
 - Flyers regarding All Degree Days, Receptions, and MSA Banquets
 - Much more, including articles from CompanionsTo receive the Triple Tau, have your Secretary contact the Editor to add your E-Mail address. No E-Mail? Send your info and \$5.00 per year to the Gr. Secretary.
5. The Joint York Rite Golf Outing:

The Golf Outing will again be presented in Early August 2011. Please consider participating or sponsoring the event again next year.
6. Membership Instruction Manual:

The Grand Chapter has begun the revising of the Officer's Work Book materials, and will be presenting them in a New Document entitled "Membership Instruction Manual". The plan is to provide the materials in a ½ page format, so that it may be inserted into your Ritual Book, making it handy for reference.
7. Web Site Redesign:
 - a. The Current Web Site is in need of updating. All the information on the site is currently manually entered, and should be driven by a published copy of the Grand Chapter Data Base. This will help in reducing the time and effort to update multiple computer records.
 - b. We are establishing a Special Committee to work on this project. If you have the talent and would like to assist with this please contact me.
8. Awards:
 - a. The Meritorious Service Awards will again be the focus of the Grand Chapter's recognition of outstanding Royal Arch Masons. As is our tradition there will be 3 Michigan Regional and one General Grand Chapter Bronze Recipient.
 - b. The Master's Pins are a long standing Grand Chapter tradition. The Blue Lodge Installation, a Master's Banquet, or other special Chapter event is a good opportunity to present the Pin. Consider inviting all local Blue Lodge Masters and members for the presentation.
9. DDI Schools and Inspections:
 - a. Covering the Royal Arch opening and closing, the reception of Grand Officers, and review of the Chapter Records and also in the Most Excellent Master's Degree.
 - b. We will be conducting 6 special sessions, 2 in each Region, where the DDI's will be meeting for their instruction. The aim of these sessions is to re-acquaint the DDI's with the Schooling Process.
10. Annual Education Seminar:

The Annual Education Seminar will again be held in January of 2011. The topic of the session this year will be "How to Help Problem Chapters". Also, how to avoid getting into trouble!
11. Records Scanning Project:

We will begin scanning the records of the Grand Chapter. Scanned records are much easier to review and once entered and indexed, much easier to locate. Would you be willing to volunteer to assist in doing the scanning please let me know.
12. Conference Calling:

We will be experimenting this year with Conference Calling to help save on Travel Time and Costs for Grand Officers, DDI's, and Committeemen. We hope this will increase our ability to effectively communicate and better serve the members.
13. Grand Chapter Program Development:

This Committee consisting of the Moving Line Officers of the Grand Chapter develops, refines and supports the Programs of the Grand Chapter. It expected that each Officer will contribute early and often to the Programs thereby developing their "Theme" and emphasis for their year.

14. Joint Meetings:

Joint York Rite Meetings may be legal, however, I prefer that the Chapters Open and Close per the Ritual at each meeting rather than just declaring the Chapter open.

15. Other Programs and Ideas:

- a. Creation of a New Promotional DVD, by the Grand Chapter of Michigan. We have been using the Indiana DVD thus far, and I would like to Re-Do it from a Michigan York Rite perspective.
- b. Redesigning an Updated Brochure, focusing on the "Enhance the Secret" theme.

Companions, your feedback and comments are greatly appreciated.

Let's make this year a most successful and happy year for Royal Arch Masonry.
